This session offers a chance to reflect on our integration of faith into daily living as we near the centennial of Konko Missions in Hawaii in 2026. In our August sermon, we embarked on a reflective journey exploring the profound and often unnoticed blessings in our daily lives. We opened with joyful greetings and acknowledged the forthcoming official funeral and 50th-day service of the 5th Konko Sama, marking a significant moment of remembrance and spiritual reflection within our community.

Daily Practice of Faith The sermon drew upon insights from the "Voice of the Universe," emphasizing the simplicity of practicing faith. It suggested that daily acts of gratitude and prayer, akin to conversing with a parent, can significantly deepen our spiritual connection. This routine of acknowledging Kami's presence in everyday departures and returns fosters a continuous and comforting dialogue with the divine.

Root of Faith through Personal Stories We were introduced to the poignant story of Rev. Michiko Tanaka, a minister of the Takachiho Church, who shared her journey of faith influenced heavily by her mother's resilience and divine trust despite personal health struggles. Rev. Michiko's narrative highlighted how her mother's spiritual fortitude and unexpected endorsement of her daughter's happiness profoundly shaped her own path in faith, leading her to embrace her role within the church rather than pursuing an early desire for marriage.

Transformative Power of Serving Others The sermon also covered the transformative experiences of individuals who have turned personal challenges into spiritual growth through service. For instance, the journey of Rev.

Michiko becoming a foster parent under challenging circumstances illustrated how faith could guide and sustain individuals through life's unpredictabilities. Her initial reluctance turned into a divine calling, where she found her true purpose in nurturing children who had faced severe adversities.

The Role of Faith in Adversity We delved into the remarkable story of Rev. Michiko's fostering journey, which began when she took in siblings Mariko, 14, and Naoki, 10, after their grandmother, who had been caring for them following their mother's death, became bedridden. This act of faith was not initially seen as a divine calling but became a profound source of personal and spiritual growth. Rev. Michiko's commitment to these children, amidst their grief and her challenges, underscored the sermon's theme of faith being a guiding force in overcoming life's hurdles.

Faith's Response to Crisis The narrative continued with a harrowing incident where a house fire threatened their lives but also brought unexpected blessings. Rev. Michiko's deepening faith helped her navigate the aftermath of the fire, which destroyed their home. Through this crisis, Rev. Michiko experienced a renewal of purpose and a deeper connection with the children, particularly highlighted when one of the children, Ai, who rarely spoke due to autism, began to verbally express affection towards her.

Conclusion: A Life of Gratitude and Service The sermon concluded on a powerful note, stressing that every interaction and every challenge is imbued with Kami's grace, urging us to live lives of gratitude and service. It reminded us that faith is not merely about enduring life's trials but transforming them into sources of joy and strength.

By embracing our daily practices, supporting each other in our communal and individual journeys, and recognizing the divine in all aspects of life, we cultivate a world enriched by faith and compassion. This message of continuous engagement with Kami and the transformation of life's challenges into blessings offers a profound perspective as we navigate our paths in faith.
